Ride Montgomery County's Victorian-Era History

Montgomery Planning's Historic Preservation 6-mile bicycle loop starts and ends at Warner Circle Special Park (10231 Carroll Place, Kensington, MD) and highlights the Victorian architecture of several nearby historic districts.

STOPS INCLUDE:



NOYES LIBRARY

Built in 1893, this small children's library is the oldest library in Montgomery County and was founded by Brainard Warner.







WARNER MANSION

The center of Kensington's Historic District, Warner Circle Special Park features a Queen Anne house and carriage house, both built in the 1890s.









ST. JOHN'S CEMETERY

This graveyard dates to the 1790s and contains burials associated with John Carroll, first bishop of the Catholic Church in the United States. St. John's is within the Forest Glen Historic District.

THE CASTLE

Part of Capitol View Historic District, the Castle was built in the late 19th century and originally served as a general store and post office.





NATIONAL PARK SEMINARY

The architecture of this turn-of-the-century finishing school was inspired by the World's Columbian Exposition of 1893, and includes a Japanese Pagoda, a Swiss Chalet, Dutch Windmill and Italian Villa-style buildings.

The Historic Preservation Office supports the Montgomery County Planning Board and the Historic Preservation Commission by identifying, designating, and regulating historic sites in the county.
