

"Placemaking inspires people to collectively reimagine and reinvent public spaces. Strengthening the connection between people and the places they share, placemaking refers to a collaborative process by which we can shape our public realm in order to maximize shared value. [P]lacemaking facilitates creative patterns of use, paying particular attention to the physical, cultural, and social identities that define a place and support its ongoing evolution". 




Purpose/Goals

- 1997 Fairland Master Plan Update
- Use placemaking as a tool to demonstrate essential qualities of great public spaces. Solicit community input to help inform recommendations for public spaces in the FBC Master Plan area.
- Re-envision a portion of the parking lot shared by the Montgomery County Services Center, Eastern Montgomery Regional Services Center, and the Briggs Chaney Park & Ride in a two day, community-led placemaking festival
- Placemaking effort will help to inform the plan recommendations and test ideas 'in the field' with community participation
- Embrace placemaking as a means of capturing shared values and generating ideas for the FBC Master Plan area.


















SIDEWALK FLOWERS

Dallas Development Code. SEC. 43-115. ANNUAL FEE FOR USE OF PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY.

(a) Except as provided in Section 43-115.1, the annual fee for a license to use a public right-of-way for the following uses is: (3) Fee for landscaping and appurtenant irrigation systems: \$1,000.

STREET CAFÉS

Dallas Development Code. SEC. 43-115. ANNUAL FEE FOR USE OF PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY.

- (b) Except as provided in Section 43-115.1, the annual fee for a license to use a public right-of-way for uses other than those listed in Subsection (a) is \$1,000 or is calculated in accordance with one of the following formulas, whichever is
- greater:
 (1) Fee for use of public right-of-way,
- including but not limited to sidewalk cafes: area X market value X 85% X 12%.

CROWDS

Dallas Development Code. SEC. 43-129. CAUSING CROWD TO CONGREGATE ON SIDEWALK.

No person shall occupy any space on the sidewalk or any space near the sidewalk where the same attracts any crowd or causes any crowd to congregate on the sidewalk or where the patrons or customers must remain on the sidewalk, for the purpose of carrying on any kind of business whether for amusement or profit. (Code 1941, Art. 143-8)
























































SITE PLAN BREAKDOWN

Play time for children and adults!










We worked really hard to make the event in Quincy a huge success. It is so cool to know we have teammates out there making the world a better place.


