Exercise 1: Ice Breaker – Envisioning

Prompt: What could be improved? Draw something you'd like to see in the community.

Responses:

- Let's have a bike lane along the ICC- this was a missed opportunity
- The Flash Bus should stop at every major area- especially at Briggs Chaney & 7th Day Adventist
- It would be great to have more bus stops on Route 29. Right now, the stops are so far away from each other; it would be great if we didn't have to walk a mile between stops
- Outdoor eateries
- Bike lanes along Route 29
- Need a (pedestrian?) overpass on Route 29

Exercise 2: Mapping - Locating

Prompt: indicate on the map areas you would like to see improved

Parks/Trails

- It would be great to have outdoor adult fitness stations in our parks. For example, individual spots along the Paint Trail, or where the courts are. Outdoor fitness stations would be great in Fairland Recreation Park too. During the pandemic, folks were working out outside every day. We need more spaces to do this.
- Senior outdoor fitness stations too.
- The recreational trails in Fairland Park are great.
- Kids love to ride their dirt bikes, however, there is nowhere for them to go, so they ride through the neighborhood, and tear up the roads. Perhaps adding a dirt bike trail in Fairland Recreation Park

Transportation/Connectivity

- It would be nice to have direct park access from the community/neighborhood.
 While Fairland Park is great, one drawback is once you get to the park, you can't connect to the neighborhood.
- We need to connect roads to neighborhoods.
- We need to build an overpass to connect communities
- There is no safe way to cross Route 29 if walking.
- When building an overpass, we need sidewalks and bike lanes to be included.
- The area needs a road that runs all the way up (north/south) to connect more people in the community; we'd like to see a bike lane also that runs north/south.; a bike lane that connects over to the southern portion of the community to have more direct biking access.

- We need more Flash Bus stops. Suggestions include stops at Fairland Road, Briggs Chaney Road, and south of Green Castle Road (on Colombia Pike/29).
- Add a metro stop for Viva White Oak.

Food Access

- We need more places to eat, such as at Briggs Chaney Marketplace for example
- The shopping center on the east side (to north), is dead.

Safety

- There is a lot of crime south of area where there was a golf course. It's a perpetual issue.
- Briggs Chaney Marketplace is not safe to go to.

Group C Summary/Report Out

- Connectivity is a major theme/area we'd like to see improved; how to get north and south, and east and west, as well as up and down Route 29.
- Lots of great ideas to better utilize parks- we need things for parents to do in parks while kids play in the parks, such as outdoor workout/fitness stations along the trail.
- We need more interesting places to eat- more sit-down restaurants vs. fast casual, such as outdoor cafes, and outdoor gathering spaces too.

Exercise 3: Open Discussion/Wrap-up

Prompt: Let's talk about things we haven't discussed yet/expand on initial thoughts.

Discussion

- There was discussion around the changing demographics of the area, as well as the future generations that will live here, younger folks, and how we need to think and plan.
 - o Population and ages here have changed. There are more people here now.
 - o Is (what we are discussing) what they (younger folks) want to see? We should ask them what they need/want, and what they would like to see. They will be the ones living here.
 - One thing we noticed is that with people coming in, there are fewer cars. Young kids don't want cars.
 - Thinking about future generations- we should put in charging stations in and bike lanes for them.
 - The things we grew up doing, is changing.
- The group discussed energy efficiency and renewable energy.
 - What about charging stations? Thinking to the future, there will be more electric cars. What are the rules for charging stations? Can we charge in our homes? (yes).
 - It's easier to install charging stations if you have a single-family home, vs. a townhome.
 Different HOAs have different rules.
 - Giant has two electric charging stations- perhaps there are other parking lots these can be installed in

- O What about the installation of solar panels?
 - We looked into a project in the community and found it cost more money to install them than the return over 20 years.
- There should be an incentive by county to put in solar panels- most homeowners will take the county up on this.
- We should be sure to put solar panels in areas where there are no trees, such as over highways.
- The group discussed the need for more gathering spaces, indoor and outdoor.
 - We need grant money for the Briggs Chaney Shopping Center- we need a green area, where people can get together.
 - o Everybody wants to be outside- especially after the pandemic.
- New housing and development was mentioned.
 - Everything is developed and built out, where will things go?
 - The amount of parking has changed- a while ago it was 2 parking spaces per home, now it's 4 spaces per home. Everything is built up-where to put in housing?
- The group discussed transportation, connectivity, as well as the schools and the growing population.
 - School expansion has put stress on traffic and roadways.
 - We need more overpasses/
 - o It's scary to cross Route 29, dangerous, not safe for biking.
- Equity
 - There are communities here that need some serious assistance.
