I use the Rec Center. It is underutilized. I use it for its fitness center. I see food distribution there but not much else. This might be a good place to highlight the community culture.

Rec Center has a summer campo and used to have senior programs but those stopped. It is accessible because of the Flash and there is parking. Rec Center isn't used as much as it could be. The buses make it accessible but it's a long walk to the stops. Maybe more bike share options between stops would make it more accessible.

The Rec Center could have more activities and events like the one that hosts Burtonsville Day.

Have more gatherings in Fairland Park.
